#### Flat Roof Maintenance

Question: How many flat roofs does FLC have? Answer: 6! Our Property Committee decided to monitor our flat roofs and discovered a variety of cracks and crevices on a couple of those roofs. The church Council approved the Property Committee to do some sealing and filling of those cracks.

FLC member and roofer Scott Quam provided the professional sealant and guided the workers to make the repairs.


First, they needed to blow the water and granules out of the major cracks. It took 3 blowers and at least 45 minutes before the sealant could be applied.

Second, they filled the cracks with a tar based sealant. Some of the cracks were a bit deep; others did not need to be filled. (See picture below.)

Third, the same process was used on a small flat roof just above the metal roof of the back foyer.

Finally, one of our members provided a lift so that the highest flat roof of the church could be examined. Fortunately, the cracks were not deep. So, no filling was needed up there. But they did find a fascinating shape made by the cracks and crevices on that roof! (See page 3)

#### **Council Highlights**

At its October meeting, FLC's Council:

- \* Learned that an **organ consultant** assessed the malfunctioning electronic control system in FLC's pipe organ. He is now exploring options to replace the current system.
- Approved financial reports for September.
- Celebrated a gift of \$60,000 to our Medical Missionaries. and Dr. Steve and Jodi Swanson. who are serving in Arusha Tanzania. This gift is part of our Caring Hearts and Hands Appeal for Missions (pink envelopes).
- Learned that cracks in two flat roofs of the church were sealed by members of the Property Committee and led by Scott Quam, an FLC member and roofer. Thank You!
- \* Voted to hire FLC member Wayne Kiefer to assume some bookkeeping responsibilities that will average around 5 hours per week. This is a separate position in addition to his volunteering as our Church Treasurer.
- Heard that Thank You Sunday will be held on November 6. It will include a menu of breakfast goodies and bringing our 2023 financial stewardship promises to the altar.

# Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

Reduce - to cut back on the amount of trash we generate

Reuse - to find new ways to use things that otherwise would have been thrown out

Recycle – to turn something old and useless into something new and useful

The 3 Rs of waste management, as these are commonly referred to, are intentionally included in priority order. The best way to manage waste is to not make it in the first place, effectively *reducing* the amount of waste. *Reusing* what already exists also reduces waste by effectively extending the life of the item, and is considered the second best option. Finally, *recycling* lessens the amount of waste sent to landfills and is thereby considered the third best option. While there is a priority order, all 3 Rs have a role in managing waste, which is an important part of caring for God's creation. How do you currently practice the 3Rs? What's another step you could take to further reduce, reuse, or recycle?
